

WHY THREE BAPTISM?

INTRODUCTION

As we are living in an age where individuals are faced with various challenges, it is good to know that Almighty God has provided a way for each person to live a victorious life. The victorious life is achieved by receiving three baptisms, which were provided for all mankind at Calvary's cross over 2000 years ago by God the Son, Jesus Christ who is the True and Living God. We shall look at the three baptisms that are available to all persons, and why they are needed.

The reason that Jesus Christ came to the earth, clothed in flesh was to provide a way for mankind to become reconciled back to God. Through Jesus Christ's crucifixion on Calvary's cross, by shedding of his holy blood, through his death, burial and resurrection, he paid the price for man's redemption from satan thereby providing the way for mankind back to Father God, and providing reconciliation between Father God and man.

Romans 5:8-10 states, "But God commendeth his love toward us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us. Much more then, being now justified by his blood we shall be saved from wrath through him. For if, when we were enemies, we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, being reconciled, we shall be saved by his life."

What a victory!

The main reason why the **First baptism** – **baptism into the Body of the Christ** is needed is so that a person can become saved, thereby allowing him to escape eternal damnation in hell after one's death. When Jesus paid the price for redemption he went to hell in man's place, and he arose victorious over death and hell, (*Revelation 1:18*). Although Jesus paid the awesome price to redeem mankind back from satan, each person must choose to accept Jesus Christ for himself. When an individual accepts Jesus as his Savior, it is referred to as the new birth, being born again, saved, or becoming a Christian. This is when the **first baptism** occurs. Instantaneously, when a person accepts Jesus Christ as his Savior, he is baptized into the body of Christ, or

placed in his body. Instead of being headed for hell the person is headed for heaven and eternal life. *I Corinthians 12:12-14* states, "For as the body is one, and hath many members, and all the members of that one body, being many, are one body: so also is Christ. For by one Spirit are we **all baptized** into one body, whether we be Jews or Gentiles, whether we be bond or free; and have been all made to drink into one Spirit. For the body is not one member, but many." This baptism is the most important baptism of the three baptisms. Praise God, the person experiences life in Jesus Christ because he has chosen to accept Jesus Christ as his Savior, which is the greatest victory of all. Amen!

In looking at why the **Second baptism – water baptism** is also needed, keep in

mind that the order of the **second baptism** and **third baptism** may be reversed. The reason why the **second baptism**, which is the water baptism is needed is two-fold. After a person has received the **first baptism** and is saved, he is then eligible for **water baptism**. One reason why a Christian should receive **water baptism** is because it is a command or ordinance by Almighty God. The Lord desires that his people do his commands. God's commands are always for our good. Jesus stated in *John 14:23* "If a man love me he will keep my words: and my Father will love him, and we will come unto him, and make our abode with him". The second reason that **water baptism** should be received is because it is an identification of the believer with the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. *Romans 6: 3-4 states*, "Know ye not,


that so many of us as were baptized into Jesus Christ were baptized into his death? Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life” .What a victory!

The Third baptism - baptism of the Holy Ghost is available to all Christians who desire to receive this baptism. Jesus told his disciples in *Acts 1:8* to wait to receive this baptism so that they would have the additional power needed to be his witnesses; and to do the work of the ministry that they were called to do. The **baptism of the Holy Ghost** with the evidence of speaking in other tongues was for the disciples who received it on Pentecost, as well as for all Christians who will believe and receive this baptism.


Through the **baptism of the Holy Ghost** with the evidence of speaking in other tongues, Christians are **further empowered** by God to carry out the great commission, to heal the sick, raise the dead, cast out demons, and to do the greater works that Jesus said **believers** would do. Amen. In *John 14:12* Jesus said, "Verily, verily, I say unto you, he that believeth on me, the works that I do shall he do also; and greater works than these shall he do; because I go unto my Father." With the **baptism of the Holy Ghost** and the evidence of speaking in other tongues, this baptism also helps Christians live a more victorious life, when they choose to obey the word of God and draw upon the additional power available from this baptism. We have looked at some reasons why the three baptisms are needed, now we will look at them in

more detail. Keep in mind that there are three different baptisms that are given by God. We will first look at **The Baptism Into The Body Of Christ**, then we will look at **Water Baptism**, and last we will look at **The Baptism Of Holy Ghost and Power**. In order for these baptisms to take place Jesus had to leave heaven and come to earth, and become clothed in flesh so that he would have an earthly body to redeem mankind.

CHAPTER ONE



THE FIRST BAPTISM:
BAPTISM
INTO THE
BODY OF CHRIST



The First Baptism takes place when a person that is unsaved acknowledges that he is unsaved, and that he needs Jesus Christ to be his Savior. God's word clearly tells us in *John 14:6* that Jesus said, "I am the Way, the Truth and the Life; no man comes unto the Father, but by me". It's necessary for those that are unsaved to ask Jesus to save them, to be born again.

In the word of God, we see that the birth of Jesus Christ was prophesied by the prophet Isaiah in *Isaiah 7:14*, that **Jesus would be born of a virgin**. The word of God states "Therefore the Lord himself shall give you a sign; Behold a virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel." Immanuel in the Hebrew means "God with us". Indeed that prophecy was

fulfilled over five hundred years later, after Isaiah had prophesied it. The word of God lets us know that the angel Gabriel came to a virgin and he explained to her that she had been chosen by God the Father to bear his son. Mary spoke words of spirit and life; she spoke words of faith. Mary knew she was a virgin and had not been with a man. Although Mary did not understand how this was going to take place, she said, "Be it unto me according to thy word". **When she spoke words of spirit and resurrection life in *Luke 1:38***, then Mary conceived. The Holy Ghost overshadowed her.

It was necessary for Jesus to take on flesh. When Jesus came to the earth, he was every bit God but he was also every bit man. Jesus chose, when he

walked this earth, to walk this earth as man. Jesus was referred to as **the son of man**, but he was the **Son of God**. He walked this earth as man to redeem mankind .Jesus Christ had to become the last Adam because the first Adam failed. The first Adam disobeyed God in the Garden of Eden and sinned. Therefore sin came into the earth and upon God's creation which included man. Satan became man's father instead of God . Praise God for Jesus Christ, who is God the Son, the second person of the Trinity, or Godhead which includes God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. Jesus Christ, God the Son came to earth clothed in flesh like man to redeem mankind through the shedding of his precious sinless blood on Calvary's cross. In *John 3:8*, there we find **Jesus' purpose for coming to the earth**. The word of

God says, "For this purpose the Son of God was manifested, that he might destroy the works of the devil." You might ask, what are the works of the devil? The works of the devil are many: sickness, disease, lack and much more. The major reason Jesus came to earth was to redeem mankind. Indeed when he was crucified, Jesus died; he was buried and went to hell. The word of God lets us know that he was victorious over the devil, because when Jesus arose, he took the keys of death and hell. The word of God tells us in *Revelation 1:17-18*, Jesus says, "Fear not; I am the first and the last: I am he that liveth, and was dead; and behold, I am alive for evermore, Amen; and have the keys of hell and death". Yes Jesus was crucified, yes he died, yes he went to hell but hallelujah he did not stay in the grave, he arose from the dead, he

was resurrected. *Romans 5:8* tells us, "But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us." Jesus has already paid the price for us, isn't that wonderful! *John 3:16* tells us of the great love that Father God and Jesus have for us. It tells us there that, "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." *It didn't say he sold him, but that he gave his son Jesus Christ.*

Once a person chooses to believe in Jesus, and acknowledges that he is **unsaved**, and **repents** of his sins and **ask Jesus to save him** and is sincere in that request, that person **becomes born again or saved**. The words born again and saved both mean the same

thing. When a person is born again or saved, it's at that very moment that the Holy Ghost comes and dwells in that persons' spirit. Man is a tri-part being or a type of trinity. He is a spirit, which lives in a fleshy body and has a soul. Man is composed of a fleshy body and has an eternal spirit that dwells inside his body. The soul is made up of our mind, our will and our emotions. It's not until that person accepts Jesus as his Savior that the Holy Spirit God comes to dwell in the spirit part of that person. If a person never calls on Jesus Christ, then that person is on his way to hell. When he dies, his body goes back to the ground, but his spirit, which is eternal, goes to hell, because he was not saved. The spirit of a man never ever dies. Once a person becomes **born again**, having asked Jesus to save him, the Holy Spirit comes to dwell in that person, as long

as that person stays connected to the Lord. As long as that person walks with God, when that individual dies his body goes back to the ground but his spirit enters into the presence of God in heaven. To be absent from the body is to be present with the Lord. It's very, very important for a person to choose life. By calling on the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, one becomes born again or becomes saved, .When a person becomes born again, it is then that the **first baptism** takes place. When a person asks Jesus to save him , at that moment the Spirit of God enters into that person's spirit, at that very same moment, **instantaneously** the individual is baptized into the body of Christ or stated another way, he is placed into the body of Jesus, which is the **First Baptism**.

In *I Corinthians 12:12-13*, the word of God tells us, “For as the body is one, and hath many members, and all the members of that one body, being many, are one body; so also is Christ”. And verse 13 tells us, “For by one Spirit are we all baptized into one body, whether we be Jews or Gentiles, whether we be bond or free; and have all been made to drink into one Spirit.” This is what is called the **first baptism**, when a person, accepts Jesus Christ as his Savior and becomes born again. God himself places that individual into his body and he is literally baptized into the body of Christ as *I Corinthians 12:13* states.

You may say what does “born again” mean? That was a question that Nicodemus who was a Pharisee had. Jesus explained to him that you can not see the Kingdom of God unless you


become born again. Jesus said you must be born again. Jesus went on to explain that the first birth is of the flesh and the second birth is of the Spirit. When a husband and wife come together to conceive a child , and that child is born that is the first birth or flesh birth. However, to become born again it is necessary to have the second birth. That is when an individual asks the Lord Jesus Christ to save him and at that time, he becomes born again, because he then has the Spirit of God on the inside of him. In *John 3:3* Jesus said, "Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God". *John 3:6-7* says, "That which is born of the flesh is flesh; and that which is born of the Spirit is Spirit. Marvel not that I said unto thee, Ye must be born again." This is the second birth. The most important

decision a person can make is to accept Jesus Christ as his Savior and become born again. Instantaneously he is also baptized into the body of Christ. Praise God because of his decision that person is saved or born again.


Once God enters the spirit of man, he has the Zoe life of God inside him. The born again man is a carrier of God, the Holy Spirit within his spirit. He is then God's mobile dwelling place. His spirit is alive because he has been translated out of the kingdom of darkness, and the devil is no longer his legal father. God has become his Father. He now can become all God desires as he makes a conscience decision each day to renew his mind. This is achieved as he reads God's word and does His word. As he does this consistently, he will grow spiritually from babyhood to a mature

adult, which is God's desire for every Christian. To be born again means a person is a new creation in Christ Jesus and he can walk victoriously as he chooses to walk in the spirit and obey God's word and not fulfill the lust of the flesh. ***Galatians 5:16*** states "This I say then, Walk in Spirit, and ye shall not fulfill the lust of the flesh".

CHAPTER TWO



THE WATER BAPTISM



Before Jesus entered his earthly ministry, he received two different baptisms. The first baptism that Jesus received was water baptism. When he came to John the Baptist, his half cousin, Jesus asked John to baptize him in the Jordan River. John did not feel worthy enough to baptize Jesus. Jesus said, "Suffer it to be so now: for thus it becometh us to fulfill all righteousness" (*Matthew 3:15*). Water baptism is an ordinance of Almighty God that every believer should receive. When Jesus was water baptized by John the Baptist, Jesus was fully immersed. In other words, he was fully covered. The greek word for baptism is baptizo, which means to be fully wet.

When Jesus was water baptized it was pointing to his death, burial and his


resurrection. When a believer receives the **water baptism**, it is then that he is identifying with Jesus' death, burial and resurrection. In *Romans 6:1-13* it says, "What shall we say then? Shall we continue in sin, that grace may abound? God forbid. How shall we that are dead to sin live any longer therein? Know ye not, that so many of us as were **baptized into Jesus Christ were baptized into his death?** Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life. For if we have been planted together in the likeness of his death, we shall also be in the likeness of his resurrection:

Knowing this that our old man is crucified with him, that the body of sin might be destroyed, that henceforth we should not serve sin. For he that is dead


is freed from sin. Now if we be dead with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him: Knowing that Christ being raised from the dead dieth no more; death hath no more dominion over him. For in that he died, he died unto sin once: but in that he liveth, he liveth unto God. Likewise reckon ye also yourselves to be dead indeed unto sin, but alive unto God through Jesus Christ our Lord. Let not sin therefore reign in your mortal body, that ye should obey it in the lusts thereof. Neither yield ye your members as instruments of unrighteousness unto sin: but yield yourselves unto God, as those that are alive from the dead, and your members as instruments of righteousness unto God". Therefore when a person has experienced **water baptism** , it's then that he should really recognize that he is identifying with Jesus' death, burial and

resurrection. And when he goes down, that "old man" goes down, that sin nature is buried. And when he comes up, he comes up into resurrected new life, even as Jesus was resurrected. Each must choose to walk in the resurrection of that new life. Each person must choose every day whether they are going to keep their body under control and go in the way God would have them to, which is the resurrected newness of life. God desires that every born again person obey him and walk in the finished work on Calvary's cross.

CHAPTER THREE



THE BAPTISM OF THE HOLY GHOST AND POWER



After John baptized Jesus Christ, it was then that Jesus came up out of the water and received the baptism of the Holy Ghost and power. It was then that Jesus was empowered to do the work he was called to do. It was when the Holy Ghost came upon him in the form of a dove (*Luke 3:22*). At the time of Jesus' water baptism, it is there that we see the trinity present, we see God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Ghost. We see Father God speaking from heaven saying, "This is my beloved son in whom I am well pleased" *Matthew 3:16-17 and Luke 3:21-22*. Jesus was being obedient to receive water baptism as the Father had commanded him to do. If Jesus needed water baptism, then we who are born again do as well. When Jesus came up out of the water, he was then baptized

with the Holy Ghost and power, Jesus did not enter his earthly ministry before this time. When he came up out of the river Jordan, it was then that the Spirit of God led him into the wilderness for forty days. The word says in *Luke 4:1*, Jesus went into the wilderness and that he was full of the Spirit of God. While he was in the wilderness, Jesus was victorious over every temptation of the devil.

Keep in mind that Jesus received the baptism of the Holy Ghost when the Spirit of God descended upon him in the form of a dove. The word of God tells us in the scriptures in *Luke 4:14*, that the Spirit of God was upon him after he came out of the wilderness. Upon leaving the wilderness, Jesus went into the synagogue and it was there that he stood up and read from

the book of *Isaiah 61:1-2*. Which was a prophecy concerning himself and his ministry on earth. When he read, "The Spirit of the Lord God is upon me", Jesus let them know that he was fulfilling the prophecy that was spoken about him. Jesus was prophesying while he was in the synagogue about what he was going to do as he read. Why? because the power of God had come upon him to begin his ministry on earth. *Luke 4:21* states "And he began to say unto them, This day is the scripture fulfilled in your ears".

Jesus knew that his people needed the **baptism of the Holy Ghost** to receive supernatural power. That is why he told his disciples to tarry in Jerusalem. He said wait for the promise. He told them why in *Acts 1:4-5*, as Jesus spoke these words, "And being assembled together

with them, commanded them that they should not depart from Jerusalem, but wait for the promise of the Father, which saith he, ye have heard of me." In verse five he goes on to say, "For John truly baptized with water; but ye shall be **baptized with the Holy Ghost** not many days hence." Jesus was reminding them, that water baptism is important. The disciples had already been saved because the Spirit of God was in them. In *John 20:22*, Jesus breathed on them, and saith unto them receive ye the Holy Ghost. Now they needed additional power. Jesus stated in *Acts 1:8*, "But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you:" *not in but upon*, "and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto uttermost part of the earth". So Jesus told the


disciples then, as well as all believers, that we need that power to be effective witnesses for him. We need the power to live victorious lives. We need the power to move in the supernatural things of God, which includes the gifts of the Spirit. We need that power for so many reasons. The power that Jesus spoke of is the Greek word *dunamis*, which means miraculous power or miracle working power. It is God's supernatural miracle working power that comes upon every person that receives the baptism of the Holy Ghost and also comes with the evidence of speaking in other tongues. After Jesus ascended up to heaven, he told his disciples to wait for the promise. It was on Pentecost that the baptism of the **Holy Ghost and power** came upon the obedient disciples. The word of God says that there were one

hundred and twenty persons, males and females, who were present that received the baptism of the Holy Ghost with the evidence of speaking in other tongues, which was when the Holy Ghost came upon them. (*Acts 1:13-15*).

So the baptism of the Holy Ghost and power is also very much needed and it is available to every born again person who desires to receive this baptism. Amen! The baptism of the Holy Ghost or the Holy Spirit is God's desire for the entire body of Christ. However, each person must chose to receive this baptism . *Acts 10:38 states*, "How God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Ghost and with power: who went about doing good, and healing all that were oppressed of the devil; for God was with him." God still desires

that every born again person receive the additional power of God the Holy Ghost today Amen! This additional supernatural power of God enables believers to move more effectively in fulfilling the great commission. (*Mark 16: 15-20*). Amen! To God Be The Glory, Praise God! Amen!

Summary





As we have seen, there are three distinct baptisms. Each baptism is separate and different, but each is needed. They are each a supernatural work of Almighty God. The first baptism takes place when a person becomes saved or born again, because they have accepted Jesus Christ as their Savior, and simultaneously are **baptized into the body of Christ**. This is the first and most important baptism. Until a person receives this baptism, they can never receive the other two. After becoming saved, the person is then eligible for **water baptism** and for receiving the **baptism of the Holy Ghost and power** with the evidence of speaking in other tongues. The order doesn't matter because some receive the water baptism after becoming born again, while others receive the baptism of the

Holy Ghost with evidence of speaking in other tongues before water baptism, but all three are needed.

I just want to encourage you that if you have not received any of these three baptisms, don't put it off because God desires that you receive them all. If you have received the baptism of the Holy Ghost with the evidence of speaking in other tongues, please use your prayer language, use it every single day. Begin to move in the things that God is calling you to move in.

What to do next





If you have not yet asked Jesus Christ to be your Savior and you desire to be saved or born again, please pray this prayer: Heavenly Father I believe that Jesus Christ was born of a virgin. I believe that he died for me, and that he arose from the dead and is now in heaven. I want to be your child. Please forgive me of all my sins. Jesus I accept you as my Savior now. Thank you for saving me, Thank you that I am now your child. Please help me to live a life that is pleasing to you, in Jesus' name, Amen!

What to do next? Now you need to ask the Lord to help you find a Christian church that believes, preaches , and teaches the whole word of God, and become a member so that you can grow spiritually. We invite you to come to Total Salvation Church, if God so

directs you to come. It is also important to develop a personal relationship with God who is your heavenly Father, so that you can come to know him as your Daddy who loves you dearly! This is achieved by consistently spending time with God in prayer, reading , and studying his word in the holy bible ,and then obeying, or doing God's word.
